
# The New Build


## Science Extension

# Business

## Business Challenge Day

The students had talks from two local business owners, took part in a Q&A session, and had a tour of UCB. They then took part in three challenges: Design a Business Concept, Branding and Marketing, and Negotiation Skills. The event was a great success and the event organiser commented: "Your students were a credit to the school, showing interest and engagement throughout." ## Cadbury World

Year 7 thoroughly enjoyed a trip to Cadbury World as part of their Enterprise Project. They toured the factory to see how chocolate is made and attended a talk on business ownership, business activity and competitors, business aims and objectives, functional departments and marketing/branding. All of their new knowledge was brought back to the Academy to help them complete their project!



## Enrichment

As part of Enrichment, Year 9 went to Drayton Manor and completed a workshop where they learnt all about Drayton Manor as a business. As part of the workshop, they were given an insight into a number of areas including: Drayton Manor's mission statement, vision, values and objectives, organisational structure and functional areas, recruitment and selection process, marketing department and campaigns, advertising methods, customer types and characteristics, customer satisfaction and expectations, conducting market research and its importance.

## Year 7 Enterprise

Year 7 students presented to real-life Business Dragons as part of their Enterprise course. During lessons, students were taught theory on pricing to promotion and branding to research. This then aided students, who were given a brief to create and develop a new chocolate bar product. Within the pitch students were asked to consider their branding, target market and the unique selling point. They presented and responded to questions from the Dragons.

## Year 8 Enterprise

In the Enterprise recruitment course, Year 8 students had the opportunity to hone their skills to become ready for the world of work. There were opportunities for them to self-reflect and construct a CV in a workshop. Interview skills were tweaked, which concluded in students taking part in real-life interviews with recruiters. This meant that students were given written and verbal feedback to improve even more for their future.

# English

## Bar Mock

On Saturday 9 November, 12 students from Years 10 to 13 attended the Regional Bar Mock Heats at Birmingham Crown Court. Students competed in three rounds of heats against nine other schools and colleges including King Edward and Thomas Telford Schools. Each heat was assessed by real-life judges and barristers and fellow students acted as jury members to agree a guilty or not guilty verdict. On the day, students beat Thomas Telford School and Birmingham Metropolitan College.

In order to prepare for the competition, students attended Session 3 and reviewed two different cases arguing for the defence and prosecution, practicing their communication and teamwork skills. Throughout the sessions, students demonstrated commitment and maturity and were a credit to themselves and the Academy on the day. Competition was high, but all remained calm in an extremely pressurised situation. Judges described the participants as 'impressive' and despite not getting through to the final, all were champions.

One of the Year 13 students commented:

**'My experience participating in the Bar Mock Competition allowed me to have an insight into what the court process is like. I found it highly interesting and enjoyed the challenge. Having participated in the competition for the past two years, it has given me relevant experience in Law and helped towards my decision of wanting to study it at university. Definitely recommend!'**







# Careers

## Work Experience

All Year 10 and Year 12 students took part in work experience during the summer term, which involved over 300 organisations offering high quality placements to our students. Students also took part in bespoke weeks which included Finance Week, Medical Week, FA Referee Course, Higher Education Week and Apprenticeship Week, all of which provided a real insight into the work of work. Several organisations were so impressed by the students on placement that many were offered paid summer work and apprenticeship opportunities for the following year.



## Careers Trips

The Careers Department have been involved in many trips this year, taking students to experience several industry sectors including engineering, car manufacturing and the NHS. Students have benefited from the exceptional industrial links that the department have developed.

## Industrialist of the Year - Lloyds Bank

The Industrialist of the Year 2019 award went to Lloyds Bank. They have supported a range of activities throughout the year, including work experience, work skills, mock interviews and supported the Finance and Apprenticeship weeks for the Sixth Form.



## Employers' Charter

Following on from the launch of the Employers' Charter in early 2018, six organisations have now been recognised with the award for their continued support for the students and staff at the Academy. They have been involved in a range of activities throughout the year and we hope this will continue during the 2019-2020 academic year.

## BMW Oxford

A group of students who have expressed interest in a career in engineering visited the BMW factory in Oxford. The students toured the factory to see the production line in action, spoke to current apprentices about their journey to date and took part in a recruitment workshop to gain a clear understanding of the application process.

## Nuffield Research Programme

This year, two Year 12 students, David Eboye and Ishreet Kaur, gained placements on the Nuffield Research Programme which takes places during the summer holidays. Following a gruelling application and interview process, they were both allocated placements in their chosen field, one at Rolls Royce and the other at Aston University. Well done to both students for securing a placement on this highly competitive programme.

## Technology & Business Event

A group of Year 12 female students attended Birmingham's first ever Technology and Business event for females, held at Innovation Birmingham. The event was attended by organisations from the sector including IBM, Capgemini, Lloyds Bank, EY, PwC and Experian. The students took part in workshops, attended keynote talks and had an opportunity to network with industry professionals.



## International Women's Day

A group of students celebrated International Women's Day by exploring a range of careers and challenging stereotypes. Guest speakers included an RAF Avionics Technician, an Educational Psychologist, Project Managers for the power and water sectors, a Locality Manager in the Skills Sector and a Senior Occupational Therapist. The students heard about their individual career journeys and the barriers they had overcome.

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## PwC Roadshow

PwC brought their roadshow into the Academy to raise awareness of their organisation and its opportunities for Sixth Formers. Students met with current members of

staff who were either apprentices or graduates. Students heard their career stories and participated in an interactive workshop focused around employability skills and awareness of the business and digital worlds.

## Sandwell Academy Achieves Gold Quality in Careers Award

Staff at Sandwell Academy have been recognised for their exceptional support in providing careers education, information, advice and guidance. The Academy once again achieved the Gold Quality in Careers Award, which was first awarded in 2015.



The award is designed to accredit good practice and encourage development in schools, academies, colleges, special schools and pupil referral units. The government recommends that all schools should work towards a quality standard for careers education, information, advice and guidance (CEIAG) as an effective means of carrying out a self-review and evaluation of the school's programme.

Sandwell Academy went through a rigorous process of checks and assessments to ensure the support it offered students was at the required standard. This involved meeting with students, senior leaders, and staff, reviewing the careers curriculum, evaluations and the resources on the website.

This is a well-deserved award for the careers and guidance team who work tirelessly to deliver outstanding careers guidance and secure positive destinations for all Sandwell Academy students.

# Cadets

## Cadets South Africa Trip

42 cadets from the Warwickshire & West Midlands (South Sector) Army Cadet Force visited Johannesburg, South Africa in Summer 2019.



To fundraise, students participated in several activities, including bag packing, and overall the group raised £80,000 in a year and a half for the Barnardos Charity, the Cadet Force and the orphanage in Africa which they visited.

Whilst in South Africa for two weeks, the Cadets took part in community engagement. The group visited a non-government funded school. This meant that the school had little income to supply equipment for the students. However, the Cadets made it possible and brought with them five suitcases full of supplies and books. On their visit they played sports with the school children, who beat them a resounding 15-3 in Netball! They also visited an orphanage and painted a Winnie-the-Pooh mural for them. The children were very happy and appreciative.

Alongside the community engagement, the Cadets went to a Giraffe Conservation, a three-day safari and planted trees in the blistering heat of 41 degrees. They also learnt about the Zulu Wars and walked The Fugitive's Trail where the British soldiers retreated from the Zulus.



Overall, the trip was a life changing experience as it really made the Cadets aware of the quality of life other people around the world have but met children who were happy and cared for each other a great deal.

On 22 May, Sandwell Academy made history by winning the National Cup treble, completing the clean sweep by beating a strong Shenfield Academy in the Elite National Cup 3-0 at The Hawthorns. Cheered on by a 400-strong crowd of Academy students, there was a fantastic atmosphere. The boys made a slow start, with nerves getting the best of both teams in the early stages. However, a fantastic turn and finish by Jamal Jimoh eased all nerves, putting Sandwell ahead to take a 1-0 lead into the interval. The second half saw Sandwell step up a gear and Billy Fielding doubled the lead early in the second half, just before Leonardo Cardoso thundered in a shot to seal the victory.

Mr Hewitt said: "This is a fantastic achievement, to take all three national trophies is something that has never been achieved before. It shows what a talented group of players we have, but we all know that talent doesn't win trophies, it also requires a lot of hard work and dedication and the lads have worked phenomenally hard and are a credit to the Academy. We are incredibly proud of the team and we will be looking to try to retain the title next year."

# Results Days

## A Level Results 2019

The Academy's Sixth Form students achieved another excellent set of A Level examination results this summer. Outstanding outcomes included 36% A\*/A grades, which represented the highest ever recorded at this level, and 82% A\*/C grades, with 100% of the students achieving three qualifications or better. Equally impressive is that once again all students have gone on to either further education, employment or training. An impressive 72% of students gained places at their first choice of university and this included numerous students going on to study courses such as Medicine or Law at some of the top Russell Group Universities.





The tougher A Level and BTEC courses have proved challenging; however, our students have consistently led the way in Sixth Form performance in the borough since the Academy opened in 2006 and this year's results demonstrate the hard work of students and staff at the Academy.

## GCSE Results

Students in Year 11 celebrated their GCSE results in August. 75% of students achieved Grade 4 or better in either English Literature or Language and 74% in Mathematics. 65% of students achieved Grade 4 or better in both English and Mathematics.

70% of all results were graded A\*-C or the new 9-4 across a range of subjects. Outcomes were especially high in Art, Science (Triple), Physical Education and Business, and BTEC Sport.



27% of students achieved the English Baccalaureate gained by achieving grade 4 or better in English, Mathematics, two Science subjects, Geography or History and a Modern Foreign Language.

79% of students achieved five or more GCSE qualifications at grade 9-4 (A\*-C), with every student achieving success in at least one Level 2 course combined with other vocational achievements.

## Year 11 Achievement Evening

In November, the class of 2019 came together to celebrate their GCSE results and receive their certificates. Students were awarded for their effort, attainment and progress in all subject areas, and others were recipients of the Special Awards.


