Message from the Careers Team

The Spring Term was busy with visits from employers to the Academy providing a range of activities to students, including an insight to their careers journey, presentations on a variety of sectors and career pathways and workshops. All of which helped to provide the students with a real view of the world of work.

Sandwell Academy continues to work closely with, and places a high premium on, all our links with businesses. Speaker Visits

In the Spring Term, we were visited by several employers who spoke to students about their profession. These included a Graphic Designer from Studio 83 who spoke about his career path, from his choices at school and university, to his first job and what he is doing now. Students were really engaged and found this very interesting, as it is an unusual and competitive career choice.



Year 11 and Sixth Form students enjoyed a presentation from Affinity Design Management about what an Architect does and the types of projects that the company is involved in.

We also were visited by Next Gen Makers who spoke to students about careers in Engineering and Manufacturing and the apprenticeship routes available. Again, students were captivated with the wealth of information and choice of careers that you can take in Engineering.

Dragons' Den Activity

Year 7 Business students took part in a Dragons' Den Activity with some local employers. The students had to prepare a marketing pitch for a new chocolate bar and present it to the "Dragons". The students researched things such as price, gaps in the market and sustaining the environment. They then designed their PowerPoint presentation based on what they had researched. The students presented to groups of two to three employers and then answered questions about their product.

The students did amazingly well, having undertaken some excellent research and then confidently presenting to people they did not know. The employers involved were so impressed and could not believe the students were only in Year 7. The students learned many skills by doing this activity including research, presenting and looking at marketing and branding, which helps them in their Business lessons.

Year 8 Mock Interviews

Students in Year 8 took part in Mock Interviews as part of their Business lesson. This involved employers interviewing students in 10 minute slots to ask them about themselves, what they are doing at school and what they want to do in the future. The employers then gave the students feedback on how they presented themselves and the types of answers they gave.

For most of these students this was the first experience they had of being interviewed. A lot of the students were nervous going into their interview but came out having enjoyed the experience and having learnt something about interviews and what they need to do to prepare.

Some of the employers involved in the sessions included HomeServe, Vinci, Hays Recruitment, Sandwell College, Hadley Group and Halesowen College.

Alisha Henry from HomeServe, who interviewed students, said:

"I have been given a great opportunity to get involved with Sandwell Academy by coming along to Dragon Den events. I have learned numerous things such as the business minds of the students, the structure of the school and the respect which is shown from students to teachers."
