Employer Presentations

National Careers Week took place from 1-5 March. The week is a celebration of careers guidance across the UK. Here at Sandwell Academy we provided some interesting and engaging virtual talks for all interested students to attend after school during that week.



The first session was from AAT about their qualifications and routes into Accountancy roles. Danielle Smith, Midlands Regional Account Manager at AAT said, "It was a pleasure to be invited to talk to the students to share my own experiences and raise awareness of the

opportunities that studying an AAT qualification can provide. I hope that it inspired those considering to pursue a career in Accounting and Finance".

We then held a session with West Midlands Police about what it is like working as a police officer and the apprenticeship routes into the force. PC Delmar Brown who gave the talk said, "It was an event whereby a lot of thought was given and it was an opportunity for us as an employer to engage with students."

Questions from our students

Some of our Year 13 students are looking at apprenticeships when they leave Sixth Form. Due to the current climate, they have submitted questions which we thought we would pass on to some of employer contacts. Thanks to BAM Construction, Dudley Council and Clover HR for their answers, which we have passed on to our students.

Is your company still planning to recruit apprentices?

BAM: We recruit annually for our Level 4 programme in the Midlands as part of the annual National Apprenticeship recruitment process which also includes opportunities in Construction management, Quantity Surveying and Civil Engineering.

Clover HR: We will soon be advertising for a Social Media Apprentice.

Dudley Council: Most apprenticeships can be all year round, but construction posts are advertised from Easter with a September start.

Do you have any tips for online interviews?

BAM: It is widely agreed that it takes 7 seconds to give a first impression – use this initial time wisely! Always ensure that you are ready, right from the outset of the interview.

Clover HR: Smile. Be prepared. Do the Research. Have questions ready. Look at the camera.

Dudley Council: Check your connections and camera before the interview. Do some research on the company. Dress for the online interview as if it were face to face. Have questions prepared for the end of the interview.

How can I stand out from the crowd?

BAM: From an interviewers perspective, what does the candidate understand about the role and the company, please remember this phrase – 'Fail to prepare – then prepare to fail' - If someone has taken the time to 'Prepare' for an interview, this will often show throughout the dialogue – it does not take much time to research a company online and information about apprenticeships in construction is readily available online too.

Clover HR: Be yourself, show your personality.

Dudley Council: Research the apprenticeship you are applying for, be clear why you are keen to join the company you are applying to.
