Provider Access Policy

Introduction

The policy statement sets out the School's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the School's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 and the Provider Access Legislation, January 2023.

Student entitlement

All students in Year 7-13 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of the careers
 programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options at each transition
 point;
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships, through assembly talks, information sessions and at our annual careers fair;
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

The School recognises that for students of compulsory school age these encounters are mandatory. There will be a minimum of:

- two encounters for year 8 to 9 pupils (first key phase)
- two encounters for year 10 to 11 pupils (second key phase)
- two encounters for year 12 to 13 pupils (third key phase)

For pupils in year 12 to 13, particularly those that have not yet decided on their next steps, there are two more provider encounters available during this period, which are optional for pupils to attend.

These provider encounters will be scheduled during the main school hours of 8:30am to 3:20pm and the provider will be given a reasonable amount of time to, as a minimum:

- share information about both the provider and the approved technical education qualification and apprenticeships that the provider offers
- explain what career routes those options could lead to
- provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider (Including the opportunity to meet staff and students from the provider)
- answer questions from students.

Meaningful provider encounters

One encounter is defined as one meeting/session between students and one provider. We are committed to providing meaningful encounters to all students using the <u>Making it meaningful checklist</u>, provided by the Careers Enterprise Company.

Meaningful online engagement is also an option and we are open to providers that are able to provide live online engagement with our students.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature in the Careers Resource Centre, which is managed by the School Careers Team. This resource centre is located in the library on the first floor of the school opposite the Careers office and is available to all students throughout the working day.
